

NATF RESTORE Program

The NATF's Regional Equipment Sharing for Transmission Outage Restoration (RESTORE) Program is designed to enhance the resilience and reliability of the energy grid by identifying sources and facilitating replacement of equipment following disastrous events. This optional, self-funding program is available to NATF members for a minimal additional cost.

How it Works

The RESTORE Program establishes a voluntary, but formal, agreement among transmission owners to commit to own, maintain, and sell to one another available spare equipment (e.g., transformers and, potentially, other transmission equipment) for an event that results in major damage to the transmission grid. This program is supplemental to, and not intended to be a replacement for, any current industry programs, such as EEI's Spare Transformer Equipment Program (STEP) or Grid Assurance.

Governance

• Each participant represented on an Operating Committee and Technical Committee

Key Terms

- Identifies inventory of designated spare equipment
- Defines each participating utility's contribution requirements

Triggering Event

 Defined in the agreement as catastrophic in nature, creating an urgent grid need for an extended period, where affected utility is unable to serve significant load

Costs and Expenses

- Low costs of administration and operations allocated only to program participants
- Contributing party made "whole" when equipment is transferred under the program

Participation and Membership

To participate in RESTORE, parties must be NATF members and sign appropriate agreements. The NATF provides website services, secure databases, and general administration of the program for participants. RESTORE currently includes 19 total companies (41 individual utilities) and provides for exchanges of spare transformers across seven different voltage classes.
